# Hana-isho Katachi no Tenkai (Advanced Hana-isho) Hiraku-katachi

Hiraku-katachi is an advanced form of Katamukeru-katachi (Inclining Form) where the Shu-shi (Subject) and

the Fuku-shi (Secondary) are positioned in a way that emphasizes the beauty of the radial form.

## Length of Yaku-eda (Principal Stems):

Shu-shi: Free

Fuku-shi: From two-thirds to equal the length of the Shu-shi Kyaku-shi (Object): One-third the length of the Shu-shi

#### Shu-shi. Fuku-shi position:


The Shu-shi can extend towards the left or right. The Fuku-shi extends in the opposite direction. The same material can be used for both Shu-shi and Fuku-shi, or they can be different.

### •Kyaku-shi position:

The Kyaku-shi is positioned in the center and slants 45 to 60 degrees forward. It can swing within 20 degrees to the left or the right from the center of the arrangement.

#### Chukan-shi (Filler) position:

When the Chukan-shi is the same material as that used for the Shu-shi and Fuku-shi, it should be positioned within a 30-degree range of the Shu-shi and Fuku-shi.

(The Chukan-shi must not extend beyon

(The Chukan-shi must not extend beyond the tip of the Shu-shi and Fuku-shi, and be no taller than one-half of the length of the Shu-shi.)
