Hana-isho Katachi no Tenkai (Advanced Hana-isho) Narabu-katachi

Narabu-katachi is an advanced form of Tateru-katachi (Rising Form) that emphasizes the beauty of a composition where three Yaku-eda are arranged horizontally in a row.

●Length of Yaku-eda (Principal Stems):

Shu-shi: Free

Fuku-shi: From two-thirds to three-fourths of the length of the Shu-shi Kyaku-shi (Object): From one-half to two-thirds of the length of the Shu-shi

- Possible Combination of Materials for the Yaku-eda:
 - 1. Same material for Shu-shi, Fuku-shi, and Kyaku-shi
 - 2. Different materials for Shu-shi, Fuku-shi, and Kyaku-shi
 - 3. Same material for Shu-shi and Fuku-shi, and a different material for Kyaku-shi
 - 4. Same material for Shu-shi and Kyaku-shi, and a different material for Fuku-shi
- Yaku-eda position

All Yaku-eda can slant to the front, back, left or right within a range of 20-degrees.

•Fuku-shi and Kyaku-shi position:

The Fuku-shi and Kyaku-shi can be placed to the left and right of the Shu-shi, respectively, or vice-versa.
